
SPOTLIGHT ON OUR LEARNING

Our Goannas have been investigating place value through Number Talks about how they think and interpret numbers. Our teachers are able to listen to the students reasons and guide them if they need support. It is great to hear what our students are thining rather than looking for a correct answer on the page. We have been playing a Tradition Indigenous Game that Uncle Kevin Shipp taught us last term - hunting animals using woomeras. While we don't have any woomeras or spear throwers here at school, our students have shown how creative they can be and have used the lacrosse sticks to propel a tennis ball and try to hit our school kangaroo.




